What? CTTC Unique Strategic Model

- Not a Satellite & A Community Partnership
- Rural Model – Serving “all our diverse communities” Non Taxing District
- Community Investments Required (Free Rental)
- MOA parameters
 - Community invests in facility
 - Community identifies programs (academic, workforce, IBEST - remedial)
 - Alamo Colleges Manages & Colleges deliver instruction
 - On-site Onboarding and Wrap Around
 - Workforce and Economic Development Integration
- CTTC to evolve from Center into SACS-COC “Campus”



Why?

- Why do we focus on regional needs?
- Should we focus regionally?

 - Industry response



How? Center Overview

- Credit Courses – 52 A&S sections (English, Math, etc.)
- Workforce Courses – 26 sections (welding, electricians, Certified Nurses Aid [CNA])
- Technical Courses – 10 yearly sections (Vocational Nursing courses)
- Academy Courses – 10 yearly dual credit sections (Manufacturing, IT security related)
- I-BEST program – expanded programs (CNA, welding, child development associate)

How? Programs Offered

Continuing Education/Workforce

- Welding – program further expanded in June 2015
 - Includes 6 sections for five nights, one day; plus corporate training
- Corporate Specialized Training
 - NEW – ACTI (Alamo Colleges Training Institute) begins late Fall 2017
 - AC & DC Electrics, Program Logic Controllers, Hydraulics & Pneumatics, OSHA
- Nursing – LVN and CNA
- I-BEST – serving a diverse population
 - CNA, welding, and child development associate – next program - medical front office



How? Academic Programs Offered

Associate of Arts

- Associate Degree
 - Substantive change through accrediting institution SACS-COC in 2014 – made the full associate degree available to students
 - Liberal Arts - Most broad and transferrable educational degree
 - Contains most of the core curriculum required for 4-year degree completion
 - Transfer articulation agreements with ALL “local” higher education providers

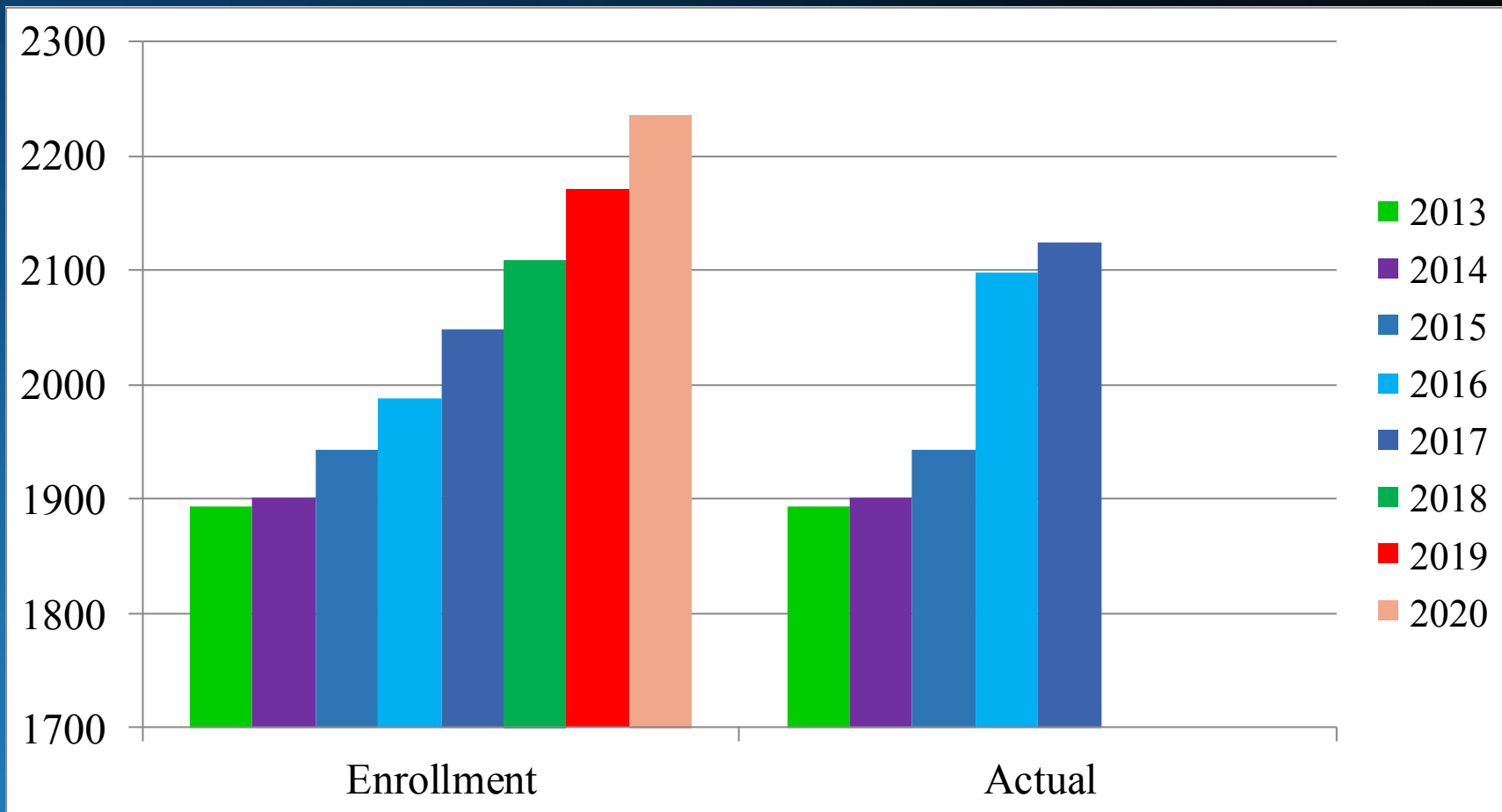


How?
